- 1. How do you feel about your community?
  - a. What is wonderful about this community?
  - Revitalization
  - Everybody knows your name, close, small town, not a 'big-city' feel, everybody knows each other
  - Helpful community, people willing to lend a hand
  - People are nice, even if you are 'from away', people are still nice, still feel like a part of the community
  - Sense of connectedness across towns
  - Community like a family, inner-connected community, generations of families rooted here, grandparents came from away, created close-knit town, families stayed tight
  - Welcoming, not a sense of people 'from away' attitude
  - Hard-working survivors, morph into what needs to happen, community survives, grows, thrives with changes, even though not everybody likes changes
  - Used to be a 'mill town', now a 'town with a mill in it'
  - What needs to improve?
  - 133 entrance could be cleaned up, 'gateway into town', some buildings covered in typar wrap, visual improvements needed
  - Downtown is looking pretty good
  - Grass growing up in sidewalks, hear complaints from residents, little changes like this could change the image of the downtown
  - A challenge is that the town workforce (public works) has been cut back
  - TIF available to some businesses, but not all, could funds be made available for façade improvements?
  - Potential brownfield sites?
  - Nothing for kids and teenagers to do

  - Lots of kids with free time on their hands
  - Lack of entertainment, things to do for youth and for everybody
  - Lack of family activities
  - Spruce Mountain is available during the winter but is competing with surrounding mountains and needs improvement
  - How to consistently promote assets like Osgood Trails in Jay
  - Few options for large venues for events
  - Limited venues available
  - People need things to do, lack of entertainment prevents people from moving to the area
  - Boat launch is adjacent to a scrap yard, could build another across the river at Spruce Mountain
  - What role, if any, do you think arts, culture, and heritage could play in addressing the above "needs to improve" items?
  - Improving Spruce Mountain (already a natural amphitheater) and other outdoor assets as public spaces for entertainment, this could provide space for youth and others to gather
  - Need to find ways to draw in volunteers
  - Highlighting local talent as a means of providing entertainment/fundraising opportunities
  - Benefiting from rising housing prices in the LA area, people are looking to surrounding areas for more affordable housing, need to make the area attractive to potential home-buyers
  - Mentoring benefits older & younger generations
  - Norlands has a 200-seat venue in the church that is available

- Norlands Living History Museum, series of annual events, every other year they host a big civil war living history weekend, about 200 re-enactors from around New England, big crowds for Maine Maple Sunday from outlying areas, they come to this area for ambiance, seasonal festivals, Christmas festival, promoted through social media, newspapers
- Apple Pumpkin Festival (big community draw)
- Sled-in, Spruce Mountain
- History Night, downtown Livermore Falls, historical fair in May
- Jay Historical Society has 1 event yearly, annual open house
- Spruce Mountain
- Home & Leisure Show at Spruce Mountain High School
- Schools have drama performances, they are staggered so they aren't all happening at once
- Smart robotics team is fairly competitive
- Livermore Community Band
- High School Band
- Parades, 4<sup>th</sup> of July, Memorial Day
- Trek down Androscoggin (Canoe), Source to the Sea (Androscoggin Watershed Council)
- Trying to get a lot happening at Spruce Mountain
- Bowman Field Fly-in (big community draw)
- Wilton Farmer's market at old Tannery, two in Farmington
- Have attempted a farmer's market where Dollar General is now, used to be by Gazebo, support to local farmers would be great
- Berry's fruit farm

- Transportation, used to be a regular bus service between towns, need to get people to and from
- Is there a way to coordinate bus service, create itineraries for people coming into Portland on cruise-ship
- Rail still goes through area, potential for the future?
- Pedestrian bridge over Androscoggin river, ideally to Spruce Mountain
- Public transportation is key
- Marketing is key for businesses to stay viable and continue operating
- Entrepreneurism, providing services to promote entrepreneurism, basic skills like how to write a business plan
- Overcoming barrier of 'it can't be done here', negative perceptions, how to get people pumped up to try new things?
- Building on local community pride, looking to heritage for inspiration, generations of stories
- We're losing information across generations, need to maintain generational knowledge, skills
- b. Where could these activities be offered? At what times of day? Of the week? Of the year?
- French Falls could be expanded, pavilion, outdoor concerts, more well-known musicians, combine with food
- Combining events, offerings, provide something for people with different interests
- Pedestrian bridge from French Falls to Spruce Mountain over Androscoggin?
- Whistle stop
- ATV Trail
- Coordination with other towns for local events to avoid overlap
- Year-round events, people get stir crazy around March, providing things to do to get people out
- Events that are family friendly and affordable
- Finding passionate people to help
- Many events funded through local business sponsors and small donations
