 - a. What is wonderful about this community?
 - Wilson Lake in the downtown
 - Good restaurant
 - Kineowatha Park, outdoor sports for kids, swimming, children have opportunities to play sports
 - **Great Recreation Department**
 - Recently started weekly local music series (outdoors) overlooking the lake
 - Wonderful library with programs for all ages

 - A lot of active churches in town, they play an active role in the community
 - Recreation Department provides several playgrounds

 - Main Street, Wilton, improved dramatically in recent years, something in nearly every store; amazing what you can buy if you know where it is, you don't really have to go to Farmington if you know where to look
 - Pumpkin Festival; Blueberry Festival
 - All the communities are very tight-knit but also open-minded; recently met a group of vegans just down the road; hidden gems
 - Blueberry Festival is a voluntary effort



b. What needs to improve?

- Looks of the place, vacant buildings; trash in lawns; takes away from the value of the place
- Part of what creates the problem is the attitude that people should be able to do whatever they want if they own property, vacuum in working together
- A while ago an abandoned property ordinance was passed but is not enforced; fire hazards; sanitary concerns; aesthetics; discouraging for people looking for housing or considering relocating; neglected properties
- Is the problem connected to population decline? Many neglected properties aren't for sale
- Lack of jobs; lack of income; Fosters closed; people living here as a bedroom community; people commute to work; like the lifestyle but can't find good paying jobs
- Some properties were taken to court and are in court, enforcement is happening but not always seen
- Calendar of positive events, currently things are a little disjointed; working to pull together promotion of events
- Worst properties on main street are owned by corporation or individuals from out of town
- Need for something geared toward health and wellness
- Blueberry Festival is an amazing thing for Wilton, would be nice to build on that, brings people back to the area
- A lot of things going on but there is no leadership to bring it all together, lack of leadership effects sense of community
- County support is needed

 - More concerts/events geared toward teenagers, need for venue for concerts? Events in general?
 - More events geared toward adults (not college age), music
 - Town committee representing alternative offerings/music/arts?
 - Excellent restaurant in town, draws people from all over, hosts various groups, real asset, would be worth it to concentrate on that building, we are not Farmington and don't want to be Farmington, we're Wilton

- People want stuff to do in the evenings, Life's Perks hosts workshops (painting) and they're packed, people need a gathering place
- Third Thursdays, restaurants were selling food outside, music... changed hands and stopped, needs somebody to re-organize
- Part-time paid events person, focusing on events, not enough people to volunteer to do it all
